

## **Positions Available**

Fort Street Presbyterian Church is seeking to fill the position of Music Director / Organist.

Located in Downtown Detroit, the church brings together people from across the metropolitan area in a shared commitment to serving people in need, celebrating music and the arts, and building a Christian community of people from many different walks of life.

Responsibilities for this position include leading music for Sunday worship, including leading the choir and playing the organ, and conducting the Fort Street Chorale, a no-audition, volunteer ensemble that performs sacred classical works, notably Handel's Messiah. The Church seeks a leader who can maintain the quality of the church's traditional music program while also while exploring other musical styles, including opening the church to the broader community as a venue for music and the arts.

This is a part-time position. Although we anticipate employing one person to both lead the choir and play the organ, we will also review résumés from individuals pursuing solely an Organist position or solely a Music Director / Choral Conductor position. #### **Director of Music**

Christ Episcopal Church - Dearborn, Michigan

Christ Episcopal Church, a dynamic, creative and highly motivated musical community, seeks a music director for weekly Sunday services, Christmas, Holy Week, and Easter. The Director of Music will provide worship music on the organ/piano and lead the choir for worship services. Additional opportunities for music leadership can be considered and developed with lay leaders and clergy, including our annual outdoor summer concert series, and other musical offerings outside of worship, including non-religious concerts and music.

The church is blessed with a beautiful pipe organ - built in 1961 by Casavant Frères

Ltée and fully restored in 2017 - as well as several pianos, a 16 member voice choir, and numerous gifted parishioners willing to contribute music to worship services. Our multigenerational choir is adventurous and very enthusiastic, and enjoys a challenge.

This is a part time salaried position of approximately 5 hours a week during the program year Sept - June, and 3 hours in the summer from the second week in June until the first Sunday in September. Flexible hours required to incorporate Christmas, Holy Week, and Easter, as well as any other ideas that may develop. There is an allowance for supply musicians to cover three paid Sundays off per year. Other flexible schedule options are possible and can be discussed. Anticipated start date September 2019.

#### **Job Description**

The Director of Music will work closely with the Rector and other worship leaders. Weekly responsibilities of the Director of Music include providing worship music on the organ and piano for Sunday worship (10:00 am) and rehearsing with the choir (currently on Sunday mornings at 9:00 am, with rehearsals from 11:30-12:30 as determined by choir and Music Director). Additional services include Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, and Holy Week. This is a part-time position, with an expectation of a flexible 5 hours a week including Sunday worship, rehearsals, special Holy Day services, and as needed meetings with the Rector to plan music. Funerals and weddings are compensated additionally.

Candidates will be required to demonstrate professional musicianship, some knowledge of liturgical music, and an understanding of a diverse range of musical styles. Interest in multilingual and non-traditional liturgical music a plus. We appreciate someone who can foster a positive and collegial atmosphere as leader of the choir. Choir members value being challenged, within the range of their mixed abilities.

Christ Church is an open, welcoming, and affirming congregation.
